Donations Needed

Sister Cathy Alley and Sister Rose Williams, from Jonesport, ME, had their house burn down this spring. They did not have insurance and are trying to rebuild. Cathy received some quotes this week to complete the framing, roof, interior walls, and siding. This will get them back in the house and there will be some additional expenses to get it fully functional but this initial cost was estimated to her at \$80,000. They have \$21,000 in cash that has been donated and/or raised from fundraisers from the Saints in Maine and elsewhere. This means they need about \$60,000 more for this project. They think they can finish the interior slowly as they have money to do so but if they raise more than \$60,000 this will accelerate their ability to completely finish and furnish the house.
